The DKG VT Executive Board voted to submit two amendments to the membership regarding the schedule of state conventions and leadership conferences. The Board has learned that many state organizations now hold a state convention every other year and a leadership conference on the alternate year A significant advantage of this new schedule would be the opportunity to provide incoming chapter officers, new committee chairs, and chapter members with up-to-date information, tools, and networking opportunities as they prepare for a new biennium. All DKG VT members would be invited and encouraged to attend a spring leadership conference (even-numbered years), emphasizing the role of all DKG members as leaders in formal or informal capacities. The state leadership team would be responsible for organizing the leadership conference. Responsibility for planning the spring convention (odd-numbered years) would continue to rotate among the chapters.

Martha Fleming, State Rules Committee Chair, has reviewed the Bylaws and Standing Rules to determine what amendments would be necessary to implement the proposed schedule for conventions and conferences as described above. She drafted two amendments which the Executive Board discussed and voted to send to the membership for action at the Spring Convention. Those amendments are printed in this Newsletter for your review.

Please refer to The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, DKG VT State Organization, Bylaws and Standing Rules 2021 for the original language. Suggested changes are below in RED.

Changes to: ARTICLE IX, ACTIVITIES, Section A Conventions, Conferences and Meetings

1. SPRING CONVENTIONS: Business of the state shall be conducted at a Spring Convention held biennially in odd numbered years, (years that state officers are elected), for the purpose of taking action on reports, adopting policy, amending bylaws, establishing the amount of dues, and electing state officers. Programs at Spring Convention should be exciting, interactive, interesting and purposeful with learning outcomes which result in professional development. Professional development certificates should be available at the conclusion of meetings. Spring Conventions shall be held at a time and place determined by the Executive



2. LEADERSHIP **CONFERENCES:** Conferences for incoming chapter officers, committee chairs and members shall be held biennially in the late spring of even-numbered years, (years that chapter officers / chairs are elected / appointed) for the purpose of providing training, meetings and workshops. Both the outgoing and incoming chapter officers and committee chairs would attend. All members would be invited and encouraged to attend to participate in programs that are intended to: provide leadership training, disseminate society information, highlight the role of all members as leaders in formal or informal capacities, and to allow for the sharing among chapters of successful and "not so successful" experiences. Leadership Conferences shall be planned by the Leadership Development Committee and held at a time and place determined by the Executive Board.

DKG VERMONT BYLAWS

ARTICLE VIII, COMMITTEES, Section C, 1, e The DKG VT Leadership **Development Committee shall** plan and implement the Leadership Conferences programs for the state and chapter officers and committee chairs. The second vicepresident shall serve as chair of the Leadership Development Committee.

ARTICLE XI AMENDMENTS Section A

Bylaws may be amended at the biennial Spring Convention or biennial Leadership Conference by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of proposed amendments shall have been published to members at least 30 days before convening the convention/conference.

STANDING RULES

- 2. Conventions, Conferences, Meetings
- 2.2 A Leadership Conference shall be held in early spring in even-numbered years to provide leadership for all members, including outgoing and incoming chapter officers and chairs. (2022)
- 2.3 Each spring the Executive Board will determine if an International Society Ambassador will be invited to the following spring convention/conference. Three names will be submitted. (2022)

3. DKG VT Executive Board

3.2 The spring Executive Board meeting shall be held on the Friday evening immediately preceding the Spring Convention and the Leadership Conference. (2022)

3-Ingredient Rose Petal Sugar Scrub

To make the sugar scrub, start with 1 cup of dried rose petals. Pulse petals in a food processor until they become teeny tiny flakes

Combine the crushed petals with 2 cups of sugar, 2/3 cup coconut oil and 6-8 drops of yourfavorite essential oil for fragrance (optional) – lavender, lemon and vanilla all blend nicely with the light rose scent.

Mix well and then spoon into a storage container. This recipe makes about 16-18 ounces of sugar scrub, so it fits nicely into a pint sized mason jar. Just add a cute fabric jar topper and a ribbon, and it would make a wonderful gift idea!

During COVID: Reflecting on Educational Travel And Teacher Exchange Program

In 1994 (almost 25 years ago!) I participated in a teacher exchange program with Project Harmony. I, along with a colleague, visited Russia in the cold of winter for 2 weeks. Traveling to a country across the ocean was a dream come true for me. I still remember the excitement planning, packing gifts and thinking about experiencing another culture firsthand. We were airborne after our original flight was delayed a day because of a major winter snow storm. We were hosted by kind and generous Russian teacher families who opened their homes to us.

We were in Moscow, St.
Petersburg and Petrozavodsk.
There are so many memories –
bitter cold, rich history and
architecture, beautiful churches,
museums, palaces, concerts, a
Dr. Zhivago worthy train ride and
visiting schools. I remember the
grandeur of St. Basil's in Red
Square and I remember the

church in the countryside ravaged by war yet still a reverent and holy place.

I have 3 boxes plus of souvenirs, mementoes and gifts. A white rabbit fur hat, scarves, nesting dolls and a tea pot to name a few. The many slides and photos are a window into the memories of the people and events they captured in time.

The other half of the exchange was Russian teachers coming to visit here in the states. The teachers hosted by my friend Nancy and I visited our school and taught lessons and answered many questions. I remember thinking hard about what was important to share about our history and culture. I remember one of the things they especially liked was the mountains as both of them lived in the city.

One thing led to another and our family then hosted a Russian student for 4 years while she was a student at St. Johnsbury Academy.

This 4 year long journey added a depth and perspective to the high school experience for our 2 children who were also attending the Academy.

I have said many times since my trip that it was life changing. I felt different - the things I experienced and the people I met widened my perspective – it was a little wider. And I am thankful for that.

Sadly my colleague and friend Nancy unexpectedly passed away a few years after the teacher exchange. I especially cherish the needlework Nancy made for me commemorating the trip.


